
### Major Take Aways from Employer Surveys

- Employers value skills and knowledge that cut across majors
- 2. Employers are interested in hiring graduates who know how to <u>apply</u> those skills

93% of employers agree that demonstrated capacity to think critically, communicate clearly, and solve complex problems is more important than major.




#### Attributes Employers Seek on a Resume






### Very Important Skills for Recent College Grads We Are Hiring

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

# Gap between importance and perceived preparation:












### What are sociology majors doing?
