UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

- Have completed 4 regular sociology courses (12 credit hours)

GRADUATE STUDENTS

- Completion of one half year of graduate study in sociology
- Graduate GPA of a B or better
- Shall maintain matriculation in sociology
